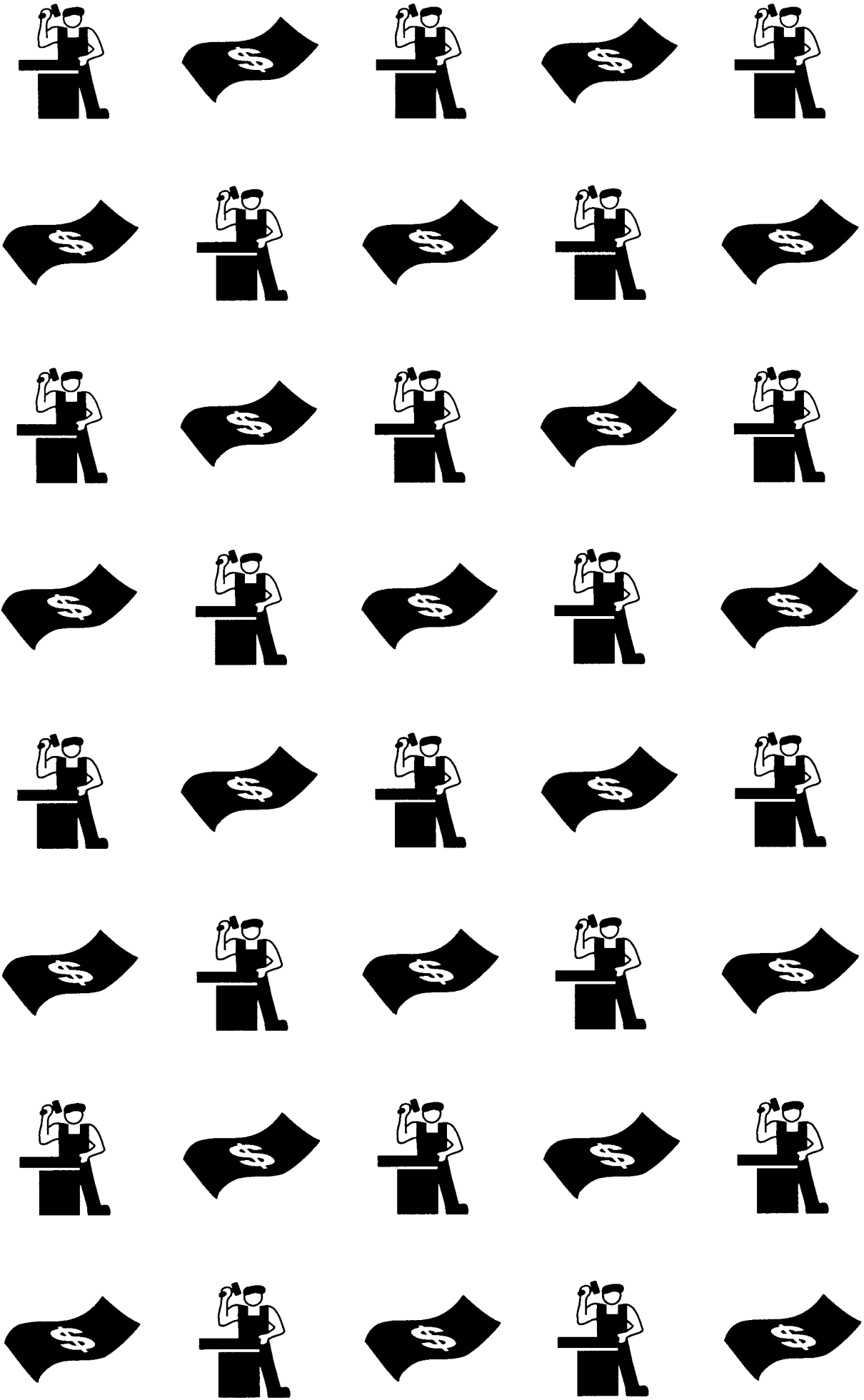


# Finance & Labor



## Section 9

### FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 2017 was 86,550 and the number of employed was 84,350. The unemployment rate decreased from 3.1% to 2.5% between 2016 and 2017.

Data for this section came from many sources, including the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism and the Hawai'i Department of Industrial Labor and Relations.
