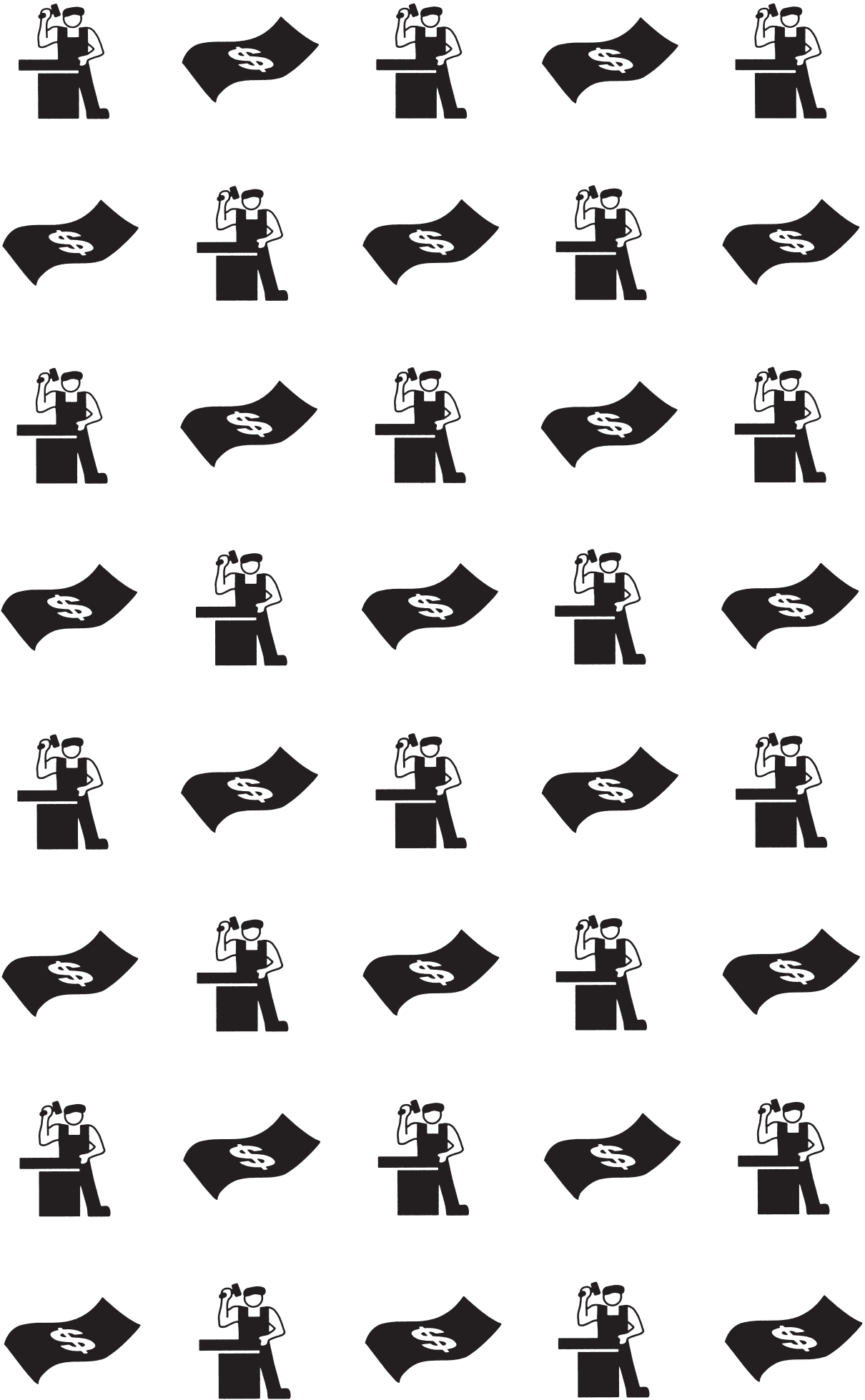


# Finance & Labor



## Section 9

### FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 2018 was 86,150 and the number of employed was 84,050. The unemployment rate decreased from 2.6% to 2.4% between 2017 and 2018.

Data for this section came from many sources, including the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism and the Hawai'i Department of Industrial Labor and Relations.
