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

Numerous agencies of the federal, state and county governments, as well as many private organizations in Maui County, in Hawai'i and on the mainland assisted the HBRL in preparing the Maui County Data Book. To them we extend our deepest appreciation for their support and cooperation.

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#### **Executive Summary**

This section provides a narrative summary of the most frequently used data contained within the Maui County Data Book. There is much more data included in the following pages than is discussed here; see the Table of Contents or the Index for more information.

According to information from the decennial censuses, the resident population of Maui County increased 20.8% from 2000 to 2010—there were 128,241 residents in 2000 versus 154,924 residents in 2010. The only county that grew at a higher rate in the state was Hawai'i County, which grew 24.5% over the same period (page 11). According to Census population estimates during each year from 2000 to 2009, this increase largely comes from natural population increases—children being born in the county.

The ethnic makeup of Maui County has not changed significantly from the 2000 to the 2010 Census. One major change is that, for the first time, the 2010 Census allowed individuals to choose more than one race. This means that direct comparisons between the two data sets are not possible. For instance, the number of people on Maui Island reporting themselves to be Native Hawaiians or Pacific Islanders fell from 27,835 to 13,262; the comparable figures for Asian ethnicities declined from 55,656 to 41,460. Rather than reflecting a decline in these populations, however, this probably means that many individuals in this group actually belonged to more than one race in 2000, and were only able to reflect this fact in the 2010 Census. According to these figures, there are 31,530 people of two or more races on Maui (page 14).

University of Hawai'i Maui College has seen significant enrollment increase in the past few years, mostly due to an increase in part-time students. In 2011, 2,95 students enrolled at Maui College part-time, while in 2008 there were only 1,395 part-time students. Full-time enrollment, on the other hand, stayed mostly steady at 1,826 full-time students in 2011versus 1,892 full-time students in 2008 (page 52).

Overall, the number of single family homes sold in Maui County has increased by 10% from 2010to 2011. This translates to a 16% increase in the total dollar volume of home sales over the same period, while the average price of a home increased by 5%. (page 72).


Condominium sales showed a very different pattern. Total sales volume decreased by 25%. This was driven by a decrease of 25% in the average price of condominium prices in the county (page 72).

Shipping traffic at Kahului Harbor has also declined. In 2010, the total weight of goods entering or leaving the harbor was 2,114,105 short tons, versus a high in 2007 of 5,629,882 short tons. This is especially problematic, as the amount of goods exported from Maui fell from 1,548,535 short tons to 776, 379 short tons. This could be due to a change in the makeup of the county's exports, as different exports may simply weigh less, but examining breakdowns by commodity types reveals that same pattern of decline. The amount of electricity used by residential customers in Maui County has declined over the last five years. In 2007, the average household used 8,228 kilowatt hours of electricity, but by 2011 this has declined to an average of 7,345 kilowatt hour (page 133). Water consumption also declined over this period, from 13 million gallons in 2006 to 12 million gallons in 2011 (page 136).

Visitor industry figures in 2011 showed much improvement. The average daily visitor census for Maui County increased from 47,619 visitors per day to 49,481 visitors (page 180). Another important indicator of recovery in the visitor sector is hotel occupancies, which have been slowly rebounding. The average occupancy rate in The low was 62.1% in 2009, and by 2011 this had recovered to 70.1% occupancy.

#### Section 1

#### **General Statistics**

"CDP" means Census Designated Place, a "densely settled concentration of population that is identifiable by name." "CCD" means Census Community Division, which is based on a "well-known local name that identifies its location." CCDs may contain one or more CDPs.

This section covers the statistics on population, population distribution, income, cost of living and other general aspects of Maui County.

The totals for population have been broken down by factors such as resident population, de facto population (the number of people actually in the county), district, density, age, race and sex.

Population statistics are based on the 2010 census figures modified by provisional estimates supplied by the American Community Survey, also a product of the U.S. Census Bureau.

Several of the tables address the cost of living and personal income which have been shown to be of great interest to users of this book. The primary measuring tool for cost of living increases is the consumer price index for urban dwellers (CPI-U). The Honolulu consumer price index has been compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics since December 1963. This index measures the average change in prices of goods and services purchased by urban households. Prices are expressed as a percent of the average levels reported in 1982–1984, the base date. Statistics for Maui County are not available, therefore the index for the City and County of Honolulu is provided.

The sources for this data are the U.S. Bureau of the Census, estimates developed by the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, U.S. Department of Commerce, Hawai'i State Department of Health, and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics CPI Reports.





#### **MAUI COUNTY AND DISTRICTS**







#### Section 2

#### **Education**

This section covers statistics on public and private schools, enrollment, number of teachers, high school graduates, enrollment at University of Hawai'i Maui College, degrees offered, number of faculty at UH Maui College and libraries.

Maui County public and private schools provide educational opportunities for students from pre-kindergarten through senior high school. UH Maui College offers courses in a wide variety of technical, vocational and liberal arts disciplines and through the University of Hawai'i Center offers 4-year University of Hawai'i degrees via the UH Center, Maui.

The Hawai'i State Public Library System in Maui County has eight locations on three islands, Maui, Moloka'i and Lāna'i. UH Maui College Library holdings include four centers: two on Maui (Kahului and Hāna), and one each on Moloka'i and Lāna'i.

The principal sources of the data on education are the Hawai'i State Department of Education, the Hawai'i Association of Private Schools, and the University of Hawai'i Institutional Research Office. On libraries, the principal sources are the Hawai'i State Public Library System, Research and Evaluation Services and the UH Maui College Library.



#### Section 3

### **Geography & Land Use**

This section presents statistics on physical geography, water areas, climate, land use, value and ownership. Information on agriculture, forests and parks may be found in other sections of the book.

Maui County consists of four of the major eight islands in the State of Hawai'i: Maui, Moloka'i, Lāna'i and Kaho'olawe. The total land area of Maui County is 1,171.0 square miles with a general coastline of 210 statute miles. The highest peak in the county is Haleakalā (Red Hill), Maui, at 10,023 feet; the largest stream is Kalialinui-Wai'ale Gulch, Maui, 18 miles; the most extensive lake or similar body, Keālia Pond (Marsh), Maui, 500 acres and the highest waterfall (in the county and in the state) is Kahiwa, Moloka'i, a 1,750-foot cascade.

The climate of Maui County is defined by average temperatures ranging from 83.8 degrees in the warmest month at Kahului Airport, Maui, to 67.4 degrees in the coolest month. Rainfall varies greatly. Annual averages for rainfall in the county range from 81 inches in Hāna, to 26 inches in Moloka'i, to 30 inches at Kapalua-West Maui Airport.

The State Land Use Commission has zoned 28,619 acres in Maui County as urban, 311,601 as conservation, 402,354 as agricultural and 8,326 as rural.

In the State of Hawai'i, land ownership data indicates that the federal government owns 3.9 percent of all land, the state and counties own 25.7 percent, and private owners (chiefly large estates) have 70.3 percent. The island of Kaho'olawe (28,800 acres) was transferred from the federal government to the State of Hawai'i in May, 1994.

Considerable caution is necessary in comparing statistics from different sources on land use and ownership. Variations in definitions and survey dates seriously affect comparability.

Sources important to these tables are the U.S. National Climatic Data Center, and The State of Hawai'i Data Book, published annually by the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism.







This section presents data on election districts, registered voters and votes cast, county operating revenues, general excise and use tax base, real property valuations and rates, government debt, and the state and local tax burden.


Local government in the State of Hawai'i is vested in one combined city and county (Honolulu, consisting of the Island of O'ahu and outlying islets), three non-metropolitan counties (Hawai'i, Kaua'i and Maui), and one area (Kalawao County) administered by the Hawai'i State Department of Health. Separate municipal governments do not exist.

Official results for the primary, general and special elections are published by the Office of Elections. Reapportionment for Maui County was effected in May 2012.

Important sources on statistics on government include: Government in Hawai'i; Revenue Trends (monthly tax collection reports), Hawai'i State Department of Taxation; State of Hawai'i Data Book, and Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism.

For more detail on government finances and spending, see Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, County of Maui; and Consolidated Federal Funds Report, U.S. Dept. of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, which has detail on Federal Government spending down to the county level. 



### **AGRICULTURE & AQUACULTURE**


This section includes statistics on agriculture and aquaculture. Statistics about farms are presented along with the value and distribution of farm and other land based herbaculture production. Fish catches and other aquaculture statistics are given. due to staff reductions in the U.S. Department of Agriculture, most county statistics are no longer available; state figures are given with comparisons to historic county data when available.

Agriculture remains an important element in Maui County's economy and land use patterns. Sugar and pineapple remain the largest crops, though the trend toward diversification of agriculture continues.

The pounds of fish landed State wide has declined significantly from 2008 to 2009, although the pounds landed in Maui County were fairly steady. Commercial aquaculture continues to grow in importance.

The data in this section comes mainly from the U.S. Census Bureau, the Hawai'i Agriculture Statistics Service, specific crop producers, and the Hawai'i State Department of Land and Natural Resources.



### **COMMUNICATION & TRANSPORTATION**

This section covers statistics on communications and transportation.

Newspapers, radio and television station statistics are included in the first section (6.1). Under transportation, statistics on fuel usage, registered drivers, aircraft and water craft facilities and freight traffic are presented.

With more than 41,000 tons of cargo and mail passing through Kahului Airport and just over 5,600,000 tons passing through Kahului Harbor, water transport remains the primary way goods reach Maui.

The transportation statistics are mostly taken from the Hawai'i State Department of Transportation.



### **ENERGY & SCIENCE**

The increase in Maui County's population has been reflected in the utilities. Consumption and use of electricity, gas, utilities, and water have all increased dramatically over the last decade. Statistics on electricity, gas, water production and consumption are covered. Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar generated about 10.0% of the electric power used on the island of Maui in 2009.

Ongoing scientific endeavors include observation of astronomical and man-made space objects from the summit of Mt. Haleakalā.






