# EDUCATION

This section covers statistics on public and private schools, enrollment, number of teachers, high school graduates, enrollment at University of Hawai'i Maui College, degrees offered, number of faculty at UH Maui College and libraries.

Maui County public and private schools provide educational opportunities for students from pre-kindergarten through senior high school. UH Maui College offers courses in a wide variety of technical, vocational and liberal arts disciplines and through the University of Hawai'i Center, Maui offers 4-year Bachelor's degrees.

The Hawai'i State Public Library System in Maui County has eight locations on three islands, Maui, Moloka'i and Lāna'i. UH Maui College Library holdings include four centers: two on Maui (Kahului and Hāna), and one each on Moloka'i and Lāna'i.

The principal sources of the data on education are the Hawai'i State Department of Education, the Hawai'i Association of Private Schools, and the University of Hawai'i Institutional Research Office. On libraries, the principal sources are the Hawai'i State Public Library System, Research and Evaluation Services and the UH Maui College Library.
